# AHL On The Move

Two cities will no longer have AHL teams, there is one affiliation move and another team goes back in time.

Houston, Texas will no longer have an AHL team. The Minnesota Wild, owners of the Houston Aeros have announced the team will be moved to Des Moines, Iowa and become the Iowa Wild.

Peoria, Illinois will no longer have an AHL team. The team was sold to the Vancouver Canucks, who in turn, are moving the team to Utica, NY and become the Utica Comets.

The St. Louis Blues will showcase their AHL players as the Chicago Wolves. They reached a 3 year affiliation agreement in late April.

The Connecticut Whale becomes extinct. The team decided to go back in time and changed the team name back to the Hartford Wolf\*Pack.

There was talk of the Calgary Flames moving their affiliation out of Abbotsford, British Columbia, but it looks like they will remain in Abbotsford for now.
