Hershey strikes it rich, wins 2011 AHL Broomball Tournament





On July 9, 2011, AHL broomball teams from Hershey, Manchester, Philadelphia, Syracuse, Wilkes-Barre/Scranton, Worcester converged at the Cicero Twin Rinks facility in Cicero, NY. Entering the competition, Philadelphia had won the last five tournament championships.

Each team played 5 games in the round robin round, then the Hershey (#5) won the task of taking on defending champion teams were seeded from 1-6. Records in round robin play were as follows:

Manchester (#2) played New England rival Worcester (#3). Like the other playoff games, the final score ended up 1-0, in favor of Manchester.

On to the Championship game...pitting Manchester (#2) against Hershey (#5). Craig Blatt scored the only goal of the game, giving Hershey their first championship. As for Manchester, it was the first time they placed higher than 4th place in the tournament.
