# **MMBC** helps New Hampshire Public Television

As they do every year, they worked "sports night", where everyone wore their sports gear...a lot of Monarchs jerseys, Boston Red Sox shirts and any other sports related items.

MMBC members were assigned tasks such as taking bids over the telephone, running bids to the boards, marking the boards and sorting bids...one or two people even got the chance to model an item or two on television. Monarchs PA announcer, Sean Sullivan, also volunteered his time to the event.



His job was to stand in front of the camera and describe each item.

Most of the booster club volunteers worked the 5pm to 9 pm shift, while a couple of people worked until after midnight. During the auction a local restaurant donates dinner and each person gets a chance to sample the goods.

Thanks to Marlene Lein, Pat Kisselburg, Bill Walch, Steve & ML Belforti, Steve Englert, Noelle Clarke, Todd & Veronica Hannemann for volunteering your time to this worthy cause.

The auction raised about \$450,000, which is vital to the station now that starting July 1st, they will lose state funding (\$2.7 million, or 31% of their budget) because of state budget cuts. NHPTV has laid off a dozen talented and dedicated colleagues and long-running local program series NH Outlook and Granite State Challenge have been placed on hiatus. The rest of the staff will have their salaries and benefits reduced.
